Not A Catch Phrase

Have you ever noticed when you think you are doing something unique, it suddenly seems to be all around you? For example, you may have just bought a new (to you) vehicle and you think “I don’t see many of these on the road,” but as soon as you drive away in your new (to you) vehicle it seems like EVERYONE has not only the same vehicle, but the same *color* of vehicle. And of course this is most noticeable when you can’t seem to find *your* vehicle in the parking lot.

Ever since I started as pastor of House of Prayer, I notice the word *collaboration* EVERYWHERE I go. (okay, maybe not EVERYWHERE, but it shows up often). What intrigues me however is that it doesn’t show up very often in church circles. Where community organizations and businesses are harnessing the power of collaboration, more and more churches seem to have a deeper and deeper commitment to individualization. Sometimes it feels like it’s just a marketing gimmick, but I think there’s so much more to collaboration than just being a catch phrase.

Maybe this is why I am so struck by our reading from Acts 4:32 a few weeks ago:

“Now the whole group of those who believe were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common.”

So often when we read this passage we get caught up in the following verses that even suggest the disciples SOLD their possessions. You’ll recall this was part of my sermon and I

know it caught a few ears. But collaboration is not necessarily about *selling all that we have*, it’s that first part, *being of one heart and soul*.

This is what I find so energizing about the collaborations that House of Prayer participates in. We collaborate with those who share a common focus with us. As we think about our RALY Program, both House of Prayer and Woodlake believe that offering a safe space for youth to explore the questions of their faith is vitally important to our Richfield community. We share our resources in order to create that space in a way that engages our youth. And I dare say it’s working – in the last year we have averaged 3-times the number of regular participants from a year ago.

This summer we will again distribute vegetables from VEAP as part of the Veggie Table events at Seasons Park Apartments. As House of Prayer, we could not supply the amount of produce that VEAP is able to make available. Residents of Seasons Park are not always able to purchase fresh produce in large quantities because of budgetary constraints. In collaborating, we accomplish more than any of us could do on our own.

I’m curious where you see collaboration around you? Are there opportunities that you’d like to pursue that you think “If I did this with someone else, I could actually make this happen?” Share your ideas, maybe the unity of Acts 4 will be realized here and now.

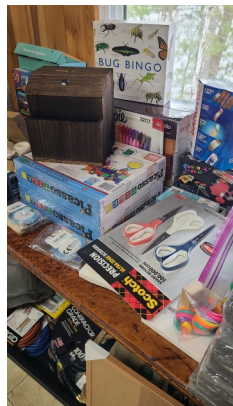

Leadership Ministry Team Update

Monthly Finance Report

March Financial Summary:

REVENUE:

In March, revenues covered all expenses, save for a few hundred dollars. Year to date offerings are below budget by \$30,380. Last year we had several one-time memorial offerings totaling \$20,000. Surplus rent revenue of \$26,942 compared to budget is currently offsetting the offering decreases.

EXPENSES:

March expenses continue to be below budget expectations, with the benefit of the continued open Human Resources positions, and savings in utilities and property costs. Year to date expenses are less than budget by \$81,901.

YEAR-TO-DATE:

Fiscal year-to-date operating surplus is \$2,073 compared to a budgeted deficit of \$72,941. A change in the dedicated funds was an interfund transfer between Preschool and Facilities. A \$4,376 transfer was made to reimburse Facilities for nursery carpet and asbestos abatement expense paid in part by Facilities Funds in December 2023. Combined Dedicated funds have increased \$9,775 year to date.

We are busy preparing the 2024-2025 budget. The LMT will review it in the May meeting. If you wish to have more details contact: Patti Benson pbenson@hoplc.org, or me at sara@anrias.com.

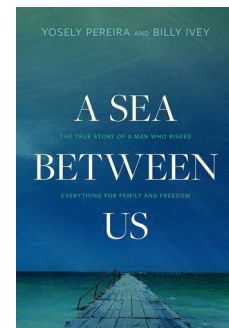
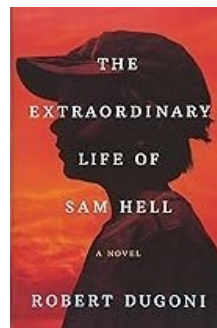

House of Prayer Preschool Closing

Following the resignation of House of Prayer Preschool Director, Nicole Olson. LMT appointed a team to explore the future of House of Prayer Preschool. Team members included Betsy Paradise (Human Resources Ministry Leader), Andry Jurcich (Congregational Development Leader), Sara Barnaby (Treasurer), Nicole Olson (Pre-School Director), Cara Wright (Director of Administration), and Pastor Eric Luedtke (Senior Pastor).

Based upon due diligence in posting the Director job position, having conversations with community preschool leaders, and reflecting on the challenges highlighted by Nicole about best practices in operating HOPP, LMT has heavy heartedly arrived at the conclusion that the most faithful course of action is to close House of Prayer Preschool in May after the end of the 2023-24 school year.

Nicole Olson will continue to be employed at House of Prayer through July 31, 2024, in order to:

1. Engage the process necessary to officially close the license of House of Prayer Preschool with the State of MN
2. Organize classroom resources and supplies to determine which items can be sold, donated to other organizations, utilized by House of Prayer, or otherwise repurpose.

Plans are underway for a Service of Holy Closure for House of Prayer Preschool and a celebration of Nicole's ministry as PreSchool Director on Sunday, June 9, 2024, as part of the 9:30 worship service.

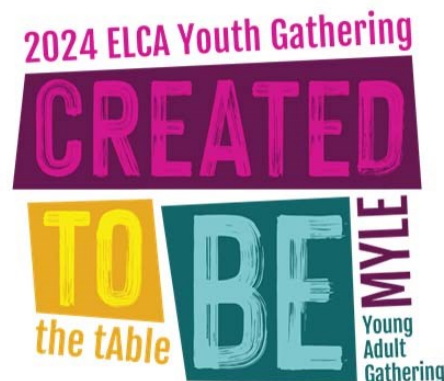
ELCA Youth Gathering
